It is great to see our Club growing so well. We had a 12½ table Mitchell on Thurs 20 July. A Club record for the 'modern era' I'm told!

Changes to the Laws

- **LAW 7:** Boards must now be kept in the centre of the table in the correct orientation. Turning the board or allowing a board to swivel can lead to the board being fouled
- **LAW 9:** Dummy now has the right to prevent any irregularity (such as a lead from the wrong hand) irrespective of whom the potential perpetrator may be. However, once an infraction has occurred, dummy is still prohibited from calling attention to it until after the conclusion of play.
- **LAW 20:** A player who realises they have given the wrong or incomplete explanation of partner's call is no longer required to immediately proffer a correction, but they must still call Director and make the correction prior to the facing of the opening lead. It will however, generally be in the player's best interests to call the Director immediately.
- **LAW 25:** The Laws still permit unintended calls to be changed providing the partner has not subsequently called, but the criterion for judging when a call is unintended has become more stringent.
